The Hamamelidaceae Family

Sweetgum is adaptable to many locations and is used by landscapers because of its fast growth and its ability create a windbreak. It's mature height reaches 100 feet.

Habitat: Sweetgum can be found in bottomland areas where there is rich, moist soil. It prefers locations where its root system is not limited.

Interesting Facts: This wood is used in cabinetry making, provides pulp and lumber.

Fruit: The fruit is a 'gum ball' measuring 1.0-1.5 inches in diameter.

Flower: The flower is monoecious; unisexual; in headlike clusters.

Wildlife value: The seeds are eaten by birds, quail and squirrels.
