This shrub has alternate, deciduous, simple leaves; and reddish brown bark with shredding appearance.

Habitat: It prefers well-drained soils; and is found in upland forests or wetland areas across the southern U.S.

Interesting Facts: This plant is one of the first of the season to produce flowers and berries.

Fruit: The fruit is a small, edible black berry that matures late spring to early summer.

Flower: The flower is a small, pinkish white bell-shape with clusters in groups of 3-5 flowers and blooms in spring.

Wildlife value: The berries are eaten by birds, and the pollen is a food source for bees, butterflies and other pollinators.
