**AN ORDINANCE TO CREATE PROSPECTIVE PRECINCTS BY THE SPLIT AND/OR MERGER OF  
PRECINCT GEOGRAPHY IN ACCORDANCE WITH LOUISIANA REVISED STATUTES  
18:532 AND 18:532.1**

WHEREAS, the **Lincoln Parish Police Jury** has the authority under R.S. 18:532 to adopt prospective precinct mergers that are not subject to the requirement that the precincts or parts of the precincts shall be in the same state, local, and municipal office voting district, and:

WHEREAS, any prospective precinct mergers shall be submitted for review and approval to the Louisiana Secretary of State and the Louisiana Legislature by December 31 of 2019, and:

WHEREAS, any prospective precinct mergers shall be effective not later than **March 31 of 2020** for the purpose of establishing block boundaries for the federal decennial census, and for reapportionment and redistricting purposes following that federal decennial census, and:

WHEREAS, any prospective precinct mergers shall be effective not later than **July 1, 2021** for all purposes, and:

WHEREAS, the **Lincoln Parish Police Jury** has the authority under R.S. 18:532.1 to change the configuration, boundaries or designation of its election precincts, and:

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Secretary of State and the Louisiana Legislature have approved the merger and/or split of precincts in **Section 1**, and:

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the **Lincoln Parish Police Jury**, that the following precincts are created by merger and/or splitting, as described in **Section 1**:
